WEMIN IN A NUTSHELL

WEMIN is a 2 year project that aims to develop and implement a new integration model for migrant and refugee women of all ages in the communities involved.



The project is funded by the Asylum, Migration and Integration Fund of the European Union and will address social, educational and professional aspects of Inclusion in eight countries throughout Europe.



OBJECTIVES

WEMIN will empower migrant and refugee women to play an active role in their community. They will then be influential within their families and social environment.



The aim of the project is far more ambitious – by promoting a close interaction between women of the host and migrant communities, stereotypes on both sides will be challenged and will strengthen the communities involved.

ACTIVITIES

A number of training and mentoring sessions, peer learning and art activities are planned within the project - these provide opportunity to initiate dialogue, intercultural exchange and friendships.
